Sail training is to be a major focus for the club this year and already a number of courses have already been held. The National Powerboat Certificate (Level 2) course was held in January. A new Hooker Skills course commenced in February and is ongoing. This opened in Kate's Cottage and is aimed at new members or anyone in the club yet to complete it. A total of four First Aid courses were held over January and February. These were run by club member Lisa McDonagh and included CPR and AED training.

In addition, regular KIS sessions commenced in January. These are held every Tuesday night in the Timberstore. Sessions so far have covered knots, safety skills, parts of a hooker and the restoration of a model hooker. Tea and cake eating has also been covered!

IRISH SAILING VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR NOMINATION FOR CIARÁN!




